

# Mother Teresa

Agnes was born 26 Aug 1910 in Skopje, Serbia (aka Yugoslavia). She was the youngest of three children born to Nikola & Dranfile Bojaxhiu. Her dad died in 1919 at age 45. Her mom struggled, but still fed the poor & took in orphans.

She encourages & gives her whole attention to the person she encounters. She is petite, frail, strong-willed, determined & fearless. Her secret is prayer & centrality of Christ. She felt if there were still poor in the world, she did not give enough. She found an old woman near death & crying. She wasn't afraid to die, but was hurt that her family abandoned her.

At first, she was teaching in the Loretta schools, but was so concerned for the poor she went out to the slums. In absence of material things, she found that just her concern alone for the poor brought them joy. It made her sad when she was sick & could not do God's work, but then realized the importance of prayer.

She had a calling to work with the poor, but had no money. She was dependent on God & others. She met with several Popes over the years. For every Christian that helped in India there were ten non-Christians. They even created a Hindu Order of nuns. Every act of love brings people closer to God. When she was in pain, she offered her suffering to God.

When she requested to help the poor in China, she was told they have no poor, but they let her bring hope to the discouraged. She took a plate of rice to a hungry Hindu family. The wife left immediately to share half the rice with her Muslim neighbors. Know your shortcomings & give them to God. She hated to see waste. **The breakdown of family life was at the root of many evils.**

She took no government aid so there were no strings attached & she was totally dependent on God. She made fund raisers pay for the administrative costs out of their own pockets. She died 5 Sep 1997.

1. They were out of food & a knock on the door brought just enough rice for dinner
2. She gave away her last rupee, then a letter came with 100 more
3. They needed a new mattress & a knock at the door brought one since he was leaving
4. They were short on food to feed 7000, the govt closed school & sent them bread
5. A new children's home would cost 50,000 rupees, just as they were given that much
6. The ideal home was selling for 9000 £, but she was given 6k; they lowered the price

1928 she became Sister Mary Teresa & set sail for Calcutta, India  
1937 she took her final vows of poverty & became Mother Teresa  
1943 famine compounded by WWII demands & war babies created more starving people  
1944 Father Celeste Van Exem became her advisor for 45 yrs  
1948 she left the convent to start the Missionaries of Charity & became a citizen of India  
1948 Jacqueline de Decker & friends had one person praying for each missionary  
1949 the 1<sup>st</sup> ten girls to help were past students & they moved into their new home rent free  
1950 their congregation became official  
1953 they moved into a larger home & given a building for people to die in dignity  
1955 opened several children's homes  
1957 her 1<sup>st</sup> mobile leprosy clinic  
1959 they extended their activities in other cities in India  
1963 Congregation of brothers started  
1965 she sent 5 sisters to Venezuela & soon other countries  
1969 laymen formed Co-Workers to pray for Missionaries of Charity  
1977 they helped victims of a flood  
1979 158 foundations scattered around the world with 1187 sisters & 800,000 Co-Workers  
1979 she won the Nobel Peace Prize  
1980 she was given the "Jewel of India" & only 1 of 3 who were invited into the Red Fort  
1982 the Pope sent her to help the victims of war in Beirut  
1983 Queen Elizabeth presented her with the Honorary Order of Merit  
1984 Missionaries of Charity Fathers & Medical Co-Workers began  
1984 Four million lepers treated to date & she went to help famine in Ethiopia  
1985 President Reagan presented her with the Medal of Freedom  
1985 she opened a center in China  
1986 she opened a center in Cuba  
1986 started a center for dying AIDS patients in the US  
1988 she went to Russia to comfort those who lost family in an earthquake  
1990 she resigned as the head of Missionaries of Charity with 3000 sisters in 90 countries  
1990 three million Co-Workers were doing small things of love  
1991 she opened a center in Albania  
1992 she went to Iraq to help the war victims  
1996 she was 1 of only 3 who received an honorary US citizenship  
1997 she received a Congressional Medal of Honor from the US
