To get the most out of this book you need to know what you want. The secret of this book cannot be found unless you are searching for it & learn to recognize it. And here it is...All achievement, all earned riches, have their <u>beginning in an idea</u>! Follow up thoughts with definiteness of purpose, persistence & a burning desire to make them reality.

Ed Barnes was a tramp & had no money to get to New Jersey, but he wanted to be inventing partners with Edison. Edison saw his determination & hired him. Barnes had the determination to accomplish this end if it takes the rest of their lives. One day none of the salesmen thought they could sell a new dictating machine. Barnes did & got a contract to sell nationwide & became rich.

Most successful people tell you that their success came just <u>one step beyond</u> the point at which defeat had overcome them [but the pushed on anyway]. Most sales are made after they were told no. Study defeat & turn them into stepping stones to opportunity. Choose a definitive goal, be obsessed with the idea, make a plan, act on it & never give up.

<u>Auto-suggestion</u> is the repetition of affirmation of orders to your subconscious mind that creates faith & translates into reality. The mind will act on negative thoughts as well as positive ones: choose carefully.

Both poverty and riches are the offspring of thought. The Latin word for "educate" (educo) means to "draw out". Anything acquired without effort and cost is generally unappreciated. We are where we are and what we are because of our own conduct. Procrastination is the lack of decision & therefore no action and only results in failure.

If you talk more than you listen, you only deprive yourself of many opportunities to accumulate useful knowledge. The average man reaches the period of his greatest capacity to create between 40 & 60. Similar to that of radio broadcasting, the human brain sends and receives signals to & from others (have you noticed how horses and dogs are sensitive enough to pick it up?). Like the force of gravity, we are drawn to our dominate thoughts (positive or negative).

If we don't like where we are, then we must change our thoughts. Study the lives of those you want to be like. Indecision creates doubt and then fear (which can become paralyzing). Either control your mind or it will control you. Recognize negative thoughts (from within or from others), reject them and replace them with positive thoughts that will keep us on the course we set.

Take action: fix your mind on the exact amount of money you desire; determine exactly what you intend to give in return for the money you desire; set a definite date for it; create a definite plan & begin at once; write out a clear, concise statement; read your statement aloud when you awake & before you sleep every day; create a master mind group who will encourage your goals.
